Plan, Manage and Review Legislative and Safety Compliance for Work in Confined Spaces

This course is designed for.

Managers or those that are responsible for organising planning and managing work in confined spaces. The manager may or may not supervise the actual job. It involves managing the work of others in, or at confined spaces; reviewing legal requirements; ensuring safety compliance; preparing procedures and appropriate documentation; and making suitable arrangements for dealing with emergencies.

Prerequisite for course

It is preferred that the candidate attending holds a formal qualification in Health and Safety such as NEBOSH or equivalent. Otherwise, suitable experience in working in and managing confined space work.

Aim

The aim of this unit is to reflect the national occupational standard for planning, managing, and reviewing legislative and safety compliance for work in confined spaces. This unit covers both water and non-water industry areas.

This unit is for managers who are responsible for organising planning and managing work in confined spaces. The manager may or may not supervise the actual job. It involves managing the work of others in, or at confined spaces; reviewing legal requirements; ensuring safety compliance; preparing procedures and appropriate documentation; and making suitable arrangements for dealing with emergencies.

Learning Outcomes

The learner Will

- Plan the management of work in confined spaces
- Manage confined space teams
- Record and review legislation relating to confined spaces
- Develop, monitor and confirm procedures for working in confined spaces
- Understand environmental, legislative and health and safety compliance
- Understand organisational requirements for confined space working
- Understand plant, tools and equipment for working in confined spaces
- Understand emergency arrangements and rescue plans

Total Qualification time

Estimated at 75 hours of those hours approximately 35 hours (5 days) of guided learning hours with the remainder as mentored project work.

Learning environment

This is a classroom-based course using PowerPoint, lecture, discussion, and various online resources. There is no practical element.

Assessment method

The course is assessed through written assessment carried out to JCQ ICE requirements. With a further assessed submission of a project. Projects must be completed and submitted 10 weeks from course completion.

- Confined space regulations

Student resource requirements

It is highly recommended that students attend with a laptop and will require internet access.
