



Level 3 Award in Understanding Planning, Supervising and Managing Working at Height (6144-31)

This course is designed for.

This qualification is for candidates in a supervisory/management position working in industries which involve working at height. This qualification may be applicable for a number of industries including construction, utilities, facilities management.

Prerequisite for course

City & Guilds does not set entry requirements for this qualification.

However the candidate would benefit from having a good understanding of Health and Safety in the work place, Risk assessment and have a basic knowledge of WAH

Aim

This unit will provide the knowledge required to plan, supervise and manage work at height. It will cover issues such as selecting contractors, staff, equipment, rescue planning and relevant health and safety.

Learning Outcomes

The learner Will

- Understand the principles of work at height
- Understand the requirements of a workplace health and safety risk assessment
- Understand the factors that influence selection of work at height equipment.
- Know factors that influence the selection of staff and contractors for work at height
- Understand the supervision and management of work at height.
- Understand planning considerations for work at height
